In Memoriam

THOMAS M. SLEEPER

(February 16, 1956 - October 15, 2022)



Thomas M. Sleeper was an American composer, conductor, and member of the Cherokee Nation.

In 1978, Sleeper was appointed Associate Conductor of the Dallas Civic Symphony. He gave the Chinese premieres of Mahler's Symphony No. 5 in 1992 and Brahms' 2nd Piano Concerto in 1993. Sleeper was the Orchestra Conductor at Stetson University in DeLand, Florida from 1985 to 1993, and Director of Orchestral Activities and Conductor of the University of Miami Frost Symphony Orchestra until his retirement in 2018. He was also the director of the Florida Youth Orchestra from 1993 to 2020. Sleeper composed many pieces of music including operas, concerti, symphonies, solo and chamber music. He leaves a legacy throughout the world, having deeply impacted many conductors, including Cristian Măcelaru, Zoe Zeniodi, Andrés Felipe Jaime, Chung Park, and Alexander Magalong.

Musician Biographies



Dr. Alexander Magalong (conductor) has served as Assistant Conductor for the Palm Beach Symphony, Associate Conductor of the Frost Symphony Orchestra, Conductor for the Greater Miami Youth Symphony, and Professor/Director of Orchestral Studies at Florida Atlantic University. He currently conducts the Pueblo Youth Symphony and the Ovation Youth Orchestra with the Colorado Springs Youth Symphony Association. He holds a Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts in Instrumental Conducting from the University of Miami. Dr. Magalong is also an Engineer Officer for the 297th Engineer Construction Company at Fort Richardson, Alaska in the U.S. Army Reserves.

Ramona McConkie (cello soloist) currently performs with the Colorado Springs Philharmonic. She is the mother of 5 children and enjoys chocolate and traveling. She has soloed with the Utah Symphony and was selected to perform at the World Cello Congress. She holds degrees in cello performance and mental health counseling and is a practicing mental health counselor.

Cynthia Robinson (concertmaster) has been playing in the first violin section of the Colorado Springs Philharmonic since 1980. After teaching for 15 years at Fountain Valley School, the Conservatory, and Pikes Peak Community College, she retired from teaching and is enjoying playing many violin and piano gigs every week.
